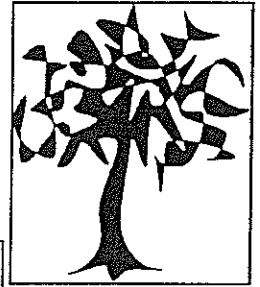

## MICHIGAN VITAL RECORDS

The Michigan Division of Vital Records and Health Statistics has indexed death records for all counties from 1867 through 1874 with a few records from 1875. This represents 81,540 individuals. The database is fully searchable by several fields: last name, first name, father's last name, county of death or date of death. The information in the records was obtained from microfilmed death ledgers for Michigan and has been transcribed by Michigan genealogists. To search the records go to:

## PUBLIC LIBRARIES OF SAGINAW, MI

The Public Libraries of Saginaw, MI have a new WWW site that gives access to Saginaw's Obituary Database. There are currently over 100,000 records in the database. The index is a work in progress and additional records will be added periodically. The obituaries may be searched by name of the deceased, including surname only, but by doing an all text search, entries that have a particular surname in the maiden name field, or other fields in the database will also be found. An all text type of search for a surname like Forest Lawn. The address for this database is:

## *ArCat and MadCat*

### *The State Historical Society of Wisconsin's online computer catalogs*

The Library and Archives collections of the State Historical Society of Wisconsin are cataloged as part of the University of Wisconsin Electronic Library's NLS system and use the same basic procedures and commands. The main differences between ArCat and MadCat are: ArCat has longer descriptions of the contents of SHSW's manuscripts collections, and MadCat includes the collections of a number of UW-Madison libraries in addition to SHSW's.

The instructions below are for using the Telnet command search interface common to both ArCat and MadCat. MadCat is also available in a Web version, which will not be addressed here.

ArCat contains descriptions for about 75% of manuscript collections, 100% of state government records, and 70% of the local government records held by the Society. For holdings not yet cataloged online, there is a card catalog in the Archives Reading Room. Visual and map holdings are currently not described in ArCat, but there is a map card catalog in the Archives Reading Room and the Visual Materials Archive reference staff will help you locate images. Both archives are located on the fourth floor of the SHSW headquarters building at 816 State Street.

MadCat catalogs only about 25% of the publications in the SHSW Library; for the rest, see the card catalogs in the Library on the second floor of the SHSW headquarters building at 816 State Street.

## ArCat/MadCat SEARCHING INSTRUCTIONS

Basic and advanced command searching instructions are on the Web at:

Assistance with sophisticated searching is available from Archives or Library Reference (contact information on reverse).

However, with ArCat/MadCat there is one overall strategy that is simple and effective: keyword or direct bibliographic searching.

Just type in and then enter the personal name, corporate or agency name, or subject by itself, without a qualifier. For example:

For materials dealing with the subject of suffrage: suffrage

For materials dealing with Ada James: james, ada

A successful search will result in a title list of items in which the search term is mentioned in the catalog description. To display the catalog record of any or all of the listed items, type in and then enter the number(s) of the relevant titles followed by the word "full"; e.g. 1 4 7-10 full.

Lists and catalog descriptions often fill more than one screen. To move between screens type and then enter ns (next screen) or ps (previous screen). To return to a previous set of screens (for example, from catalog descriptions back to the original list), type and enter ret.

### ADDITIONAL SEARCHING HINTS

THE TRUNCATION SYMBOL (or "wild card") \* is useful (more so in ArCat than in MadCat) when the precise form of name or subject term is uncertain. Entering civilian conservation corp\* will pull up collections where the precise term is either "corp" or "corps", and diar\* will list collections whose description contains either the term "diaries" or "diary".

LINKING TERMS OR NAMES with the word and often allows specific collections to be identified even if the exact name or title is not known. For example, entering pepin county and naturalization will result in a specific list of Pepin County naturalization records, whereas entering only pepin or only naturalization would yield much longer and less precise lists. If you still get a long list, add another and with another term; e.g. civil war and diar\* and gettysburg or vernon county and wisconsin and history.

TO LIMIT BY DATE add the phrase and date ????-???? to the search term. For example, for suffrage collections from only the last half of the 19th century:  
suffrage and date 1850-1900

### SPECIAL HINTS FOR CIVIL WAR SEARCHING

For collections related to specific Wisconsin regiments, enter the regiment's name and number in the following format:

wisconsin infantry regiment, 23rd or wisconsin cavalry regiment, 2nd

To identify "official" (i.e. state) military records enter:

militia or national guard and wisconsin and date 1861-1865

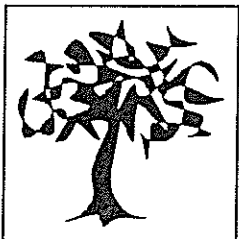
