

American Four Square 615 S. Washington Ave.

The American Four Square is an American house style popular from the mid 1890's to the 1920's/1930's. The American Four Square was plain, often incorporating hand-crafted "honest" woodwork (compared to the elaborate mass produced Victorian elements). The hallmarks of the style include a basically square, boxy design, two and a half stories high, usually with four large boxy rooms to a floor, a hipped roof with a center dormer and a large front porch. The accent trim on this house reflects the rectilinear architecture.
