COUNTY HISTORIES

Using older county histories can be helpful in doing genealogical research! If a county history has been published for the county you are doing research in, you may find information for your ancestor. Usually the genealogy society in that county has a copy of the history if one has been published. If there isn't a genealogy society in the county you are searching in try the historical society. You may also surrounding counties. Sometimes the biographies included in the book will include where that person lived before living in the county the history is about. The biography will sometimes include the maiden name of the wife; -even who her parents were. Also children and who are married, County History biographies can be U of family information. Sometimes a biography about one person will list another person who also has a biography written on them!

In the index you may find your person listed on several pages, You may find them listed for committees, belonging to organizations in the area, etc. You may also find if they were involved in any way in the civil war. There is usually a section written about the civil war involvement for that county. You will find lots of different types of information written county histories. If a history has been written for 'your county' you Will find it very interesting reading; and hopefully find information about your ancestor.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Members of MAGG,

My year as president of MAGG is coming to an end. Election of officers will be held at the next meeting. Thanks for the honor of serving.

I must share one more family history item which I learned about at the Hackman family reunion last month. When my grandfather on the Kuennen side was 3 years old, his mother died in childbirth. When my great-grandfather Gerhard Hackman was about age 13, his mother died, too. His father had died years before. At age 15, the family sent Gerhard from Indiana to Iowa to live with his first cousin who was my Grandpa Kuennen. This is all possible because my mother's grandfather was Gerhard Hackman. So my great-grandfather on my mother's side, grew up with my grandfather on my father's side of the family. My parents never talked about this. Relatives never hinted about it. The two men were never close friends. But it does make sense. Imagine a 3 year old adapting to a step-mother who came a year after his mother died. Then five years later a cousin moved in--a cousin who was six years older. My grandfather was a wonderful man but we never knew much about his childhood. Five step-brothers and sisters were added to his life during the next ten years. He had a complicated childhood and yet he weathered the storm and became a pillar of the community. He served on the school board for many years and he sang in the church choir for 50 years. He and his saintly wife raised a family of 13 children. Learning this relationship with my great-grandfather makes me admire my grandfather even more.

I hope your genealogy searches bring you as much joy as mine do.

EIGHTEEN NEW CITIZENS

Eighteen residents of Wood county were granted their second citizenship papers by Judge Park in circuit court last week, several more being refused their papers when testimony taken showed they had either failed to take their share of Liberty Bonds without just reason or had not taken the proper attitude toward their country during the World War. Several failed to produce their clearance papers from foreign countries.

Erick Anderson drew a sharp rebuke as well as a refusal for second papers when the testimony in his case showed he had claimed exemption from the draft as being an alien, but following the close of the war has requested admittance into the citizenship rolls of this country.
